■ Captured in Cairo
 Toronto filmmaker and York University professor John Greyson, known for work that fuses an achingly beautiful aesthetic with sharp social critique, is being detained in Egypt on dubious charges. Greyson and another Canadian, medical doctor Tarek Loubani, were arrested on Aug. 16 after they stopped to ask for directions. According to reports, the men and seven other foreign citizens have been accused of storming a police station and of having some kind of involvement with the Muslim Brotherhood. At the time of their arrest, the two Canadians were en route to Gaza. Loubani was returning to a hospital in the North Rimal district, where he's worked in the past, and Greyson, a vocal supporter of human rights in the area, was pursuing filmmaking plans. As of press time, the Canadian government was still waiting for Egyptian authorities to release evidence pertaining to the allegations, and the Prime Minister's Office had expressed concerns for the safety of both men.

 Like summertime, SummerWorks is a heady, sweaty, and woefully condensed whirlwind that happens just once a year.
